BIBLIOGRAPHY OF ANCIENT CYPRUS
FOR THE YEAR 1975

The main aim of this bibliography is to present new publications on ancient Cyprus. It is a simple continuation of the „Bibliography of ancient Cyprus for the year 1974” previously published in the *Folia Orientalia* 1977¹. Many supplementary items dealing with the preceding year have been included, and a new map of the archaeological activities of the Department of Antiquities of the Republic of Cyprus and of foreign missions has been added. As in the previous volume of the *Folia Orientalia*, my space is strictly limited, so I had to choose only the most important items. The abbreviations used can be easily interpreted. In cases of doubt, users of the bibliography are invited to check the abbreviations in the *Fasti Archaeologici* or *Nestor*. One-word titles are not as a rule abbreviated.

I am glad to say that the bibliography for the years 1969, 1970—1971 has had several reviews. I should like to express my warm gratitude to Prof. P. Aström, Prof. A. M. Bisi, Mr. K. Hadjioannou, and Prof. I. Todd for their remarks and constructive

suggestions concerning the arrangement and classification of items. Encouraged by favourable opinions, I continue this bibliography. I think it is useful, and quite by chance it will soon be the only one in the field, as unfortunately the publication of the bibliographies in the *Kypriakai Spoudai*, and in the *Epetiris* (of the Cyprus Research Center) was interrupted (in the volumes for 1975 and 1976 respectively), and the *Fasti Archaeologici* have been published with ever increasing delay (volume for 1972 still has not appeared). The demand for speedy information is recently only partly fulfilled by the *Nestor* — Mycenaean bibliography of Prof. Emmett L. Bennett, Jr. The bibliography of ancient Cyprus is addressed to the increasing number of people interested in the archaeology and history of Cyprus. This bibliography would be more detailed and extensive if more scholars would like to cooperate. Cypriological publications appear in very many journals published all over the world and scattering of items is great. What is even more important, many journals come to Krakow too late and sometimes I even note gaps in library collections. This is the reason that I should like to ask all people and institutions interested to send all their publications on ancient Cyprus directly to my home address: Zdzisław J. Kapera, ul. Borsucza 3/58, 30-408 Kraków, Poland. In this way my task would be much easier and the bibliography more useful. Books, journals, and off-prints (even mimeographed materials) would be welcome.

A considerable part of the materials have been compiled from the collections of the Jagiellonian University Library in Krakow. This was possible thanks to the really friendly attitude of the workers of the Subscription and Purchase Department.

I should like to express my deepest thanks to all my friends from the Cyprus Research Center and to Director of the Public Information Center in Nicosia, who have helped me so much with obtaining Cyprus journals and books, to Professor V. Karageorghis, the Director of the Department of Antiquities, Cyprus, who has kindly permitted to reprint a map from his Annual Report 1975 here, and to all the authors from different countries of Europe and America who have kindly sent me their off-prints, in this way making my work much easier. In addition, several

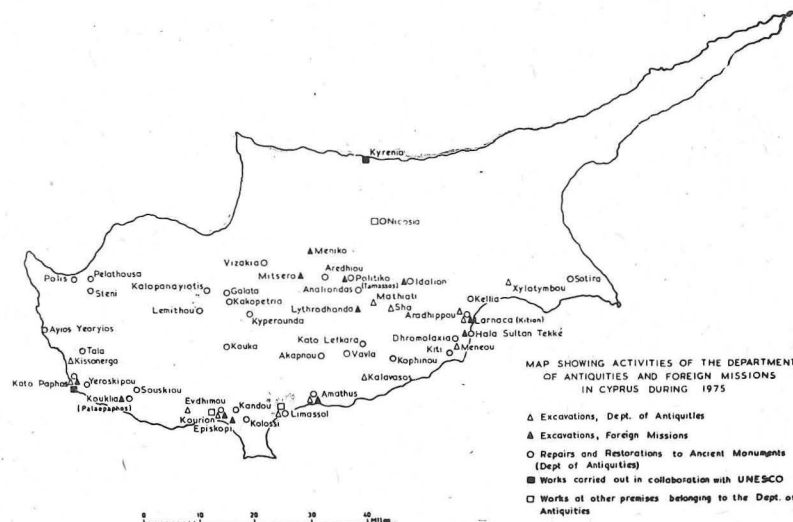
archaeological institutions and museums have been exchanging publications with me, and I am greatly obliged to them for that.
